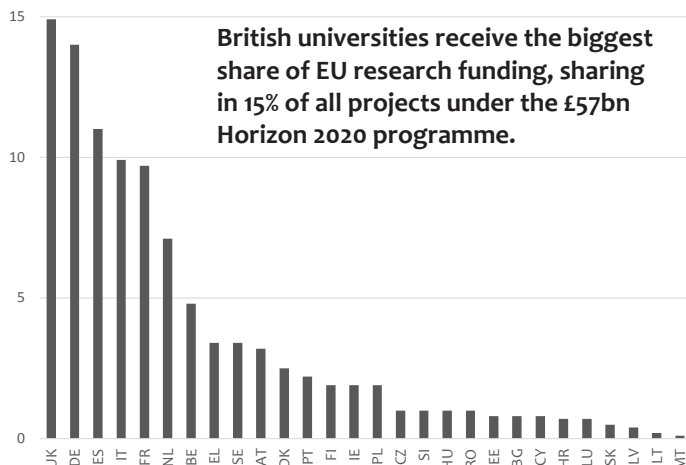

Scarborough Business Park

The European Regional Development Fund part-funded a £100 million expansion of Scarborough Business Park. The additional 1000 square metres of retail space will create some 1000 new jobs in the area. As well as this, the development will include care showrooms and a green travel plan. The project was singled out as a brilliant example of sound business judgement at the Government Business Awards.

Richmond railway station

Described as a 'monastic Gothic station like no other', the old station building in Richmond received one of the largest European grants ever awarded at the time in North Yorkshire for restoration and development.

The station now offers a range of facilities for locals and visitors including a cinema, an art gallery, and a heritage centre. It has also hosted events including trade exhibitions and seminars.

283,800 are employed in North Yorkshire. That's **283,800 people who are better off** because of 28 days leave a year, an 11-hour break between shifts and work-specific health and safety rules.

In North Yorkshire there are **76,800 part-time workers**, all of whom benefit from an EU entitlement to the same hourly pay as full-time workers and have the same leave entitlements.

There are **135,900 women** employed in total in this area. Thanks to the EU, they have protection from dismissal if pregnant, the right to be paid the same as men for work of equal value, and laws protecting them against discrimination.
